

Director's Note

WRITE TO YOU FROM THE MIDST of an enormous shadow. A shadow cast by history, legend, and myth. It is the shadow of Bram Stoker.

Stoker was a man of the theatre, serving as famous actor Henry Irving's business and tour manager for twenty-five years. He wrote *Dracula* over a period of seven years, writing only during his summer vacations. It is altogether fitting then that Dracula has found a home not only in book stores, but on the stage and in film. The stage presents an audience with the same conundrum faced by the reader of the novel: pieces of a

story; fragments and clues, left partly unassembled; events awaiting a detective.

Stoker wrote the book during the period of the Jack the Ripper murders and the trial of Oscar Wilde for gross indecency. The character of Dracula is based, partially, on Vlad the Impaler, the imperious Henry Irving, Oscar Wilde, and the eccentric poet Walt Whitman. Whomever the inspiration, Stoker presented the world with a character that has fascinated readers and audiences for 116 years.

Dracula first appeared on stage in 1927 with Bela Lugosi as the count, a role he repeated in the film version of 1931. A revival of the play in 1977 starred Frank Langella and ran on Broadway for three years and was followed by a film version in 1979. The most recent version was released in 1992 by the director Francis Ford Coppola. A few months ago the novel was on a list of the one hundred best novels of all time.

Proof of Dracula's enduring power is in the numerous incarnations offered to a ravenous public. Dracula has appeared in more films than any literary character: thirty and counting. Tonight's performance is the third stage version and was written in 1996. There exist five musical versions, ten television adaptations, one radio play, three songs, two comic book versions, seven video games, and one pinball game. The list staggers the mind. Currently there are three vampire programs on television and NBC has announced an October start for a new series, entitled, of course, *Dracula*.

I would be remiss not to thank my talented and dedicated cast and my strong right arms: Nikki, Nora, Spencer, Rod and all the rest of the crew who work tirelessly to make tonight's production possible.

As the Count himself would say, "Welcome to my house! Enter freely and of your own will". Your host, a haunting being, waits for you... a brilliant, seductive, fanged beast who wants to suck the blood from your throat. Hide from that. So, sit back, try to relax and enjoy *Dracula*.


