



Director's Note

ROWING UP, I LOVED DOLLY PARTON. I had records ranging from "Me and Lit-



ever touched the song. Dolly was definitely a part of

my childhood. When the movie, "9 to 5" came out, our whole family loaded up and went to the movie theater to see it - something that was rarely done with us - and especially for a movie that was as ornery as this! Still, I remember all of us laughing and enjoying it together.

When I heard that a musical was being developed based on the movie I was beyond excited - and especially since Dolly was involved. I never had a chance to see it while it was on Broadway, and I missed the national tour so I thought my chances of experiencing it may be over. However, when the show was voted in for our slate I bought the cast recording and immediately fell in love with the music. As I read the script, I realized that this was a show that I'd love to tackle and I'm honored to have had the chance to direct it.

As we began the journey with this show, we realized that the music that Dolly Parton wrote was fun, catchy, and surprisingly difficult to sing! The rhythms and harmonies are intricate and challenging. Our music director, Mike Dotson, has tackled the task of teaching this like a farmer trying to catch a 300 pound pig! (A little inside joke!) Additionally, our choreographer, Natalie Bradley, has challenged the cast with her fun interpretations to add movement to the songs - while they are trying to sing them as well. Assistant Director Bob Heflin is a master at making scenes flow and along with tech director, Rod Oden, has created transitions and an environment that are on that "big theater" level. Ann Simonton (who is now on her 6th show with me as costumer) has been diligent in her costume design to represent that period when the 70s were transitioning into the 80s. Our production assistant, Mary Lucas, has been the voice behind the scenes to keep everything in check and to help remind me to get things done. As director, these people make my job easy! Isn't that what a CEO does? He surrounds himself with people to do all the work and then he takes the credit! In all seriousness though, this show would not happen without a staff of people who are willing to share in a vision and make it happen.

The cast we have for the show can be described with one word: Amazing! They have embraced the challenges we have put in front of them with positive attitudes and a fun loving spirit.

As you watch 9 to 5 The Musical I hope you enjoy what you see. It's a fun show with great music but also has a bit of a message - especially for women. I'll let you figure it out though - because the message may be different for you than it is for me. Enjoy our orneriness and laugh with us as we have a blast on stage. I think Dolly would be proud!




