

The Ballad of Sweeney Todd

T WAS A TOWN OF MACHINERY AND TALL CHIMNEYS, out of which interminable serpents of smoke trailed themselves forever and ever and never got uncoiled." So wrote Charles Dickens of London at the dawn of the Industrial Age in the mid 19th century, the London of Sweeney Todd.

The origins of Sweeney Todd, the demon barber of Fleet Street, and his accomplice in crime, Mrs. Lovett, are shrouded in mystery. Some people believe that

the story derives from the 14th century French ballad about a Parisian barber, and further link it to an account of a series of murders committed by a barber in Paris around 1800. Others claim he was derived from the legend of Sawney Beane, who haunted Scotland around 1600, during the reign of James I. Some evidence suggests that the legend has its roots in a recorded London Murder of the mid 1780's that occurred on Fleet Street near the spot (Number 186) where the shop of Sweeney Todd is believed to have existed.

What we do know now with certainty is that the saga of Sweeney was first introduced to British readers in November 1846 in The People's Periodical and Family Library, a weekly penny newspaper. The publication, printed appropriately on Fleet Street, was one of the so-called "penny dreadfuls" read by the increasingly large mass audience of the 19th century indus- An 1880s edition of Sweeney Todd



trial England. In March 1847, the story was dramatized on the stage of London's Britannia Theatre. Its authors were probably Thomas Peckett Prest and George Dibdin Pitt, whose names appeared on 27 plays that year alone. The String of Pearls or The Fiend of Fleet Street was the Brit's biggest smash. The Prest-Pitt version was the first of many, as Sweeney Todd took his place beside Jack the Ripper, Dick Whittington, and other larger-than-life figures of London. He shocked and titillated generation after generation of British audiences.

In 1973, Stephen Sondheim, while visiting London, encountered Christopher Bond's play Sweeney Todd in London's East End. After deciding that Bond's radical revision of the Todd legend was the best for his purposes, he persuaded Harold Prince, Hugh Wheeler, and other colleagues to participate. Sondheim's Sweeney Todd opened at New York's Uris Theatre on March 1, 1979, amid controversy and critical acclaim. Bond's version, and subsequently Sondheim's, introduced new elements into the saga-revenge and social commentary. Todd is presented as a victim of society, a sympathetic figure driven to crime when his wife and child were taken from him by a lecherous judge, and Todd is himself unjustly imprisoned. Fifteen years later he escapes and returns to London to avenge his wrongs. It is at this point that our tale begins...

Who's Who in the Cast & Crew

DANIELLE BRAHAM (Ensemble) is appearing in her first production with the Actors Guild. She is somewhat new to the world of theatre, having performed in only four other shows: Once Upon a Mattress (Wench #2) and The Pirates of Penzance (Daughter and soloist) with Theatre de Junesse. Danielle also appeared in Parkersburg High School's production of The Wedding Singer (chorus).

BARBARA FULL (Ensemble) is beginning her 40th year with the Guild, acting in many productions, including Dixie Swim Club, On Borrowed Time, Secret Garden, Into the Woods, Beauty and the Beast, Civil War, 1776, Damn Yankees, Honk! and Barnum. Directing credits include Shrek, Rent, Avenue Q, Doubt, Annie, Tommy and Full Monty (music director) and she is vice president of the Guild's board of trustees. He has served on the board of trustees at the Guild and was honored to receive the 2013 Bayley Award for his service to the organization. He is an anesthesiologist with United Anesthesia Inc., who has been a proud corporate sponsor of the Guild for many years. He thanks his wife, Kathy, for allowing him to "play" with his Guild family.

BRITTANI HILL (Johanna) has recently been seen on the Guild stage in Avenue Q as Kate/Lucy and Shrek The Musical as Sugarplum Fairy/Gingy. Some of her other productions include: Hairspray, All Shook Up, The Secret Garden, The Full Monty, and Dracula. She also appeared in A Piece of My Heart at MOVP and OCTA, Little Shop of Horrors, Grease, Alice in Wonderland, and 4 am at

in Spain. He has performed lead roles in H.M.S. Pinafore, Patience, Gianni Schicchi, Die Zauberflöte, The Three Penny Opera, and Le nozze di Figaro, and has conducted dozens of zarzuelas, operettas, gala and choral concerts and has performed solo concerts here and abroad. He is slated to conduct Les Misérables in spring 2015.

KEYSY LINDSEY-ABELLÁN (Ensemble) debuted on stage in Elda, Spain as an infant with her mother in the zarzuela Agua, azucarillos y aguardiente. Now a freshman in high school, she is in her twelfth year of ballet training and is currently studying voice with her parents. Sweeney Todd is her second ensemble production, having played both a pirate and a policeman in The Pirates of Penzance with Theatre de Jeunesse. She is also an active choir member and occasional soloist at her church.

SU VOYCIK MEREDITH (Mrs. Lovett) first took the Actors Guild stage in 1977 when she made her debut with Joyce Haynes in Carousel, also starring fellow cast member David Rexroad. She has brought years of enjoyment to Guild audiences with her performances in Evita (Eva), My Fair Lady (Eliza), Nunsense (Mary Amnesia) and Little Shop of Horrors (Audrey) to name just a few. Over the years she has performed with MOVP, Smoot Theatre, Marietta College, Showboat Becky Thatcher, in addition to dinner theatre tours and Nashville Children's Theatre European tour. Su feels blessed to return home to the Guild stage.

DAVID REXROAD (Judge Turpin) This year was an assistant director on *Shrek the Musical* at the Actors Guild and directed *Camelot* for Theatre de Jeunesse. He made his Guild acting

debut at age 15 playing Tony in *The Boyfriend*. Other Guild work includes Rutledge in 1776, Billy Bigelow in *Carousel*, and directing *Anything Goes* and *The Women*. She has been awarded for such things as "Best Duet", "Outstanding Actor", and "All-state Cast" in both regional and statewide thespian festivals.

GALEN SMITH (Sweeney Todd) has performed onstage since 1980. Notable performances include Archibald Craven in *The Secret Garden*, Beast in *Beauty and the Beast*, Pirate King in *The Pirates of Penzance*, Charlie Anderson in *Shenandoah*, Fagin in

Oliver!, Captain Von Trapp in The Sound of Music, and Matthew in Cotton Patch Gospel. He has won awards for some performances, including two Khalil Awards here at the Actors Guild. Additionally, Galen has done TV commercials, professional theater, and several church productions. In order to "pay it forward", Galen has also worked with youth theatre groups as a director and acting coach.

CARTER RICE (Policeman) is appearing in his first production on the Guild stage. As an avid member of Parkersburg High School Players he participated in Damn Yankees, Radium Girls.
