

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

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

Perhaps that is why I loved them so much

(much more than the Munsters, I have to be honest). Yes, the Addams family members were outcasts, but they didn't seem to be bothered by societal standards and norms. Haven't we all felt at one time or another that we were outcasts, too? Haven't we all wanted to just say 'hang it all!' and torture Pugsley? Of course! Haven't we all wanted to be as passionate as Gomez for Morticia, and yet also be as aloof as Morticia to that passion? Admit it. Theirs is a love that transcends the humdrum, workaday existence that so many of us call life.

Well, we can put all of that behind us as we watch this new story unfold. The Addams family is in crisis. Wednesday has fallen in love with, dare I say it, a "normal" young man. This is the age old story of a daughter bringing home the boyfriend, who just happens to represent everything that the father can't abide. I remember a few fathers looking at me with that I-don't-trust-you glint in their eyes. Even eccentric people have real-world problems.

Two snaps (a reference to the old TV theme) for this kooky musical that takes a fresh look at one of our favorite pop culture families. I think Charles Addams would be proud of the long history of his family, starting in The New Yorker in 1938, and finally coming to this musical homage to his artistic brilliance. Enjoy the spooks and specters as they come to terms with the same problems we deal with in this mysterious world.

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Director's Note

IRECTING A SHOW THAT HAS FAMILY IN THE TITLE, it's hard not to think about that important unit in our lives and in society.

What can we learn from this experience with this kooky family?

How are they like our own fami

How are they like our own families? How are they different? And, what kind of family are we talking about?

Any time a show is cast, the actors and crew become a family for a short time. Of course, we share many hours of preparation, but to do a show together definitely creates a special family bond: everyone is working toward a common goal—a good show. Our family members are actors, singers, dancers, crew members, directors, choreographers, designers, builders, painters,



costumers, props creators, musicians, technicians. Our audience mostly sees the actor members of our family, but it is practically impossible for those family members to feel confident enough to perform their roles without the important support of the rest of the show's family.

And, just like the Addams family, not every member of our family might be considered 'normal' by society's standards. One of the things I love most about being a member of the Actors Guild family is how open we are to all people; the only thing we require is a love of theatre.

Recently Dave Garrity, a beloved member of our Actors Guild family, died and the funeral was scheduled to be in our auditorium. I was involved in *Tom Sawyer* at the time and I was struck by how eagerly the young cast of that show stepped up to move all our rehearsal paraphernalia out of the auditorium for this man they didn't even know. It was enough for them to know that he had been an important part of our Actors Guild family and they were honored to do their part in preparation for the service.

We hope you love our Addams Family characters and, perhaps they will make you think of your own family members with love, understanding and appreciation of their unique qualities.





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
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
