

But our biggest honor is to continue offering shows to you, our faithful audience members who, show after show, season after season, award us with your applause, your smiles, and your appreciation of this wonderful theatrical world we have created here.

Director's Note

ette Midler... Whoopi Goldberg... Carrie Fisher... Dame Maggie Smith... Mary Wickes... Kathy Najimy... Patina Miller... Victoria Clark... Raven-Symoné... These are just a few of the amazing and powerful women who have been involved with Deloris Van Cartier, a lounge singer who has to hide out in a convent from her crime lord boyfriend, one way or another.

The movie Sister Act was originally written by hilarious playwright Paul Rudnick for Bette Midler to star in for Touchstone Pictures, a division of Disney. Unfortunately, Midler was unavailable so Disney turned, instead, to Whoopi Goldberg fresh off of her Oscar winning turn in Ghost. Goldberg brought in popular Hollywood script doctor, Carrie Fisher, to punch up the script and mold it more to Whoopi's strengths. She also had a hand in casting Dame Maggie Smith as her foible, the Mother Superior. Add in Hollywood character actresses of the past, Mary Wickes, and the present, Kathy Najimy, and comedy magic was born!

Then the phenomenon of musicals based on movies took Broadway by storm and it was just a matter of time before those nuns who learn to sing got to do so on Broadway and producer Whoopi Goldberg made it happen. Starring newcomer Patina Miller as the new Deloris, past Tony Award winner Victoria Clark was called upon to lend her angelic voice to Mother Superior. Opening to mostly positive reviews, the show was nominated for five Tony Awards including Best Musical with noms for both Miller and Clark as Leading and Featured Actresses, respectively. After a year, when ticket sales started to sag, Disney star Raven-Symoné was brought in to boost business for the final six months of the run. Since that time, powerful women of all kinds have gotten to don the habit and show their stuff on tours and in countless regional, dinner theater, summer stock, and community theater productions.

And now we get to add the luminous Heather Hepburn to the list. A veteran of many shows both onstage and off here at the Guild and at MOVP, Heather gets the chance to take the spotlight and run away with it at last! Joining her is long time Guild veteran Barbara Full as Mother Superior. Together these women have worked hard to bring this hilarious, yet heart-warming tale to our stage. I couldn't be prouder as a director than I am of their work and dedication and I couldn't be more thrilled to call them both friend!
