

President's Letter



elcome to *Little Shop of Horrors*, a great and timeless show which I'm sure you will love! It's one of those shows which is loved by so many people that it is revived quite often. This is our second time presenting this show, having also presented it in our 1987 season.

I was honored to be in that production as one of the "Shoo-Bop Girls" playing the role of Chiffon. As I think back to that wonderful experience I am struck by how we

pass the torch in this business. I am happy to pass the torch of Chiffon to Jaliyah Townsend and I know she will do a phenomenal job.

Earlier this season we presented *To Kill a Mockingbird* with the passing of the torch in the role of Atticus Finch from Charlie Matthews in our 1997 season to Dave Prather. As I look at the list of shows I am filled with memories of many productions and many torch passings - the role of Tevye in *Fiddler on the Roof* from Eldon Frank in 1975 and 1990 to RJ Lowe in our 2018 production, the title role in *Sweeney Todd* from Brian Berry in 1989 to Galen Smith in 2014, Lily in *The Secret Garden* passing from Sherry Wilson Braid (1995) to Brianna Carson Clegg (2012).

And sometimes the torch is passed more than once; in the role of Abigail Adams in 1776, I received the torch from Jean Tobleman, who played it in 1972, I played it in 1986, then passed it on to Judy Cheuvront in our 2002 production. As a performer I can say that it is very satisfying knowing a role you prepared for and cared about is still considered timely enough to be revived and presented to today's audiences.

I would like to encourage any current or hopeful performers out there to be ready for this torch passing as we are always looking for new talent —in fact, there is a new opportunity. In my last President's Letter, I explained how we choose shows and announced our new season. Well, sometimes, things don't go as planned, and this is one of those times. We had hoped to present the show which received the highest number of votes in our first slot: *Ring of Fire: The Music of Johnny Cash*. Unfortunately, we weren't able to find a music director for that show, so we are now replacing it with *You're a Good Man, Charlie Brown*, a show we produced in 1983, which will be a great way to kick off our season. The auditions are June 25 and 26, so come on out —we have torches to pass!!

n December 1959, B-Movie director Roger Corman, in an effort to beat changing industry rules that would have prevented producers from "buying out" an actor's performance in perpetuity AND to take advantage of using existing sets that were due to be torn down in 2 days, began filming a movie under the working title The Passionate People Eater—a movie that would later be known as The Little Shop of Horrors.

Using sets from a film called *A Bucket of Blood* and stock actors that Corman had used in previous films, The Little Shop of Horrors was released in 1960; it slowly gained a cult following when it was released as the B movie in a double feature, first with *Black Sunday* and later with *The Last Woman on Earth*. The movie featured a very young Jack Nicholson in a small role as a dental patient.

Fast forward to 1982 when an Off-Off Broadway musical production of *Little Shop* of Horrors premiered at the WPA Theatre on May 6th before moving to the Off-Broadway Orpheum Theatre on July 27th of that same year. The critically acclaimed musical won several awards including the 1982–1983 New York Drama Critics Circle Award for Best Musical, the Drama Desk Award for Outstanding Musical, and the Outer Critics Circle Award. With a book, music, and lyrics by the writing team of Alan Menken and Howard Ashman, the same duo responsible for Disney's *The Little* Mermaid, Beauty and the Beast, and Aladdin, the musical would run Off-Broadway for 5 years and 2,209 performances, closing on November 1, 1987.

Little Shop of Horrors has become one of the most popular musicals ever produced. Between April 1 and December 31, 2018, over 230 theatres will perform Little Shop of Horrors...and that's just the ones we know about. There will likely be new additions to that list as the year goes on.

I cannot begin to describe what an absolute pleasure it has been to work with this amazing cast, crew, and staff. We have worked tirelessly to bring these iconic characters to life. We hope you enjoy the show!


