

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President's Letter



or those of you who have been attending our shows over the past several seasons, I'm sure you are aware of our ongoing Capital Campaign. What started out as an effort to enhance our accessibility, by renovating the lobby and adding an elevator, has turned into a much bigger project, as we discovered that our infastructure also needs extensive renovations. This has more than doubled the original cost estimate.

Phase One was completed last year with the replacement

of our heating and cooling system, updates to our electrical system, sprinkler system on the lower level, larger rest room facilities downstairs and a new Green Room. If you have not checked out our lower level, I hope you will do so tonight.

Now we are ready to move on to Phase Two which will install a sprinkler system and additional fire safety features in the auditorium and on stage. This will also include a new fire curtain. We plan to start the first part of this Phase soon after *Mary Poppins* closes.

In order to accommodate this installation we will need to move our next two productions. Our Guild Builders show, *Madagascar*, *JR*., is now scheduled for January 24 – February 1, 2020 and will be relocated to Blennerhassett School. Following that show is *Sense and Sensibility*, and we are very pleased to announce that this production will take place in the Little Theatre at WVU-P. Over the past year we have been collaborating with WVU-P on a number of projects, and we look forward to even more of them in the future. The dates of *Sense and Sensibility* remain as originally announced for February 28 – March 14, 2020. We plan to return to our own theatre for the remainder of the year. We thank you in advance for traveling with us as we make our theatre safer.

All of these renovations come with a big price tag, as you may well guess. So we hope you will be generous at this performance as our volunteers ask your participation in our 50/50 raffle. The proceeds all go to our Capital Campaign.

Thank you for attending Mary Poppins. We know you are going to be enchanted!

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Director's Note

elcome to Number 17, Cherry Tree Lane and the magical world of Mary Poppins, the no-nonsense, yet loving nanny that P.L Travers created in her book series 85 years ago. This character was further brought to life by Disney in the iconic 1964 movie (which earned Julie Andrews an Oscar for her performance) and the 2018 sequel starring Emily Blunt. The stories of Mary Poppins have brought a touch of magic to the lives of many children (and adults) over the decades. From flying with an umbrella to bouncing across rooftops with tap-dancing chimney sweeps, there are iconic scenes that we all carry with us. The stage show is not merely a re-

production of the film, however. It combines story elements from the original book series with all the best scenes from the Disney film and throws in a stronger plot and background story for the Banks family to create something that is entirely new, yet still just as magical. So which Mary Poppins is the "real" one? Well...all of them. Each version (stage, screen, and even the one in your own memory) pays "practically perfect" tribute to the original creation of P.L. Travers.

However, even though this show is called *Mary Poppins*, she is not the main focus of the plot. The story centers around the Banks family who are having trouble actually functioning as a family. The parents



are distracted and distant. The children act out and crave attention. Mary Poppins merely flies in to supply the right amount of magic to help them just in time. It is the lessons they learn and the decisions they make that supply the plot of this wonderful show.

This show has been quite an undertaking for us here at the Actors Guild. We have tried our best to add our own magic with new technical elements and special effects. You may see things that you have never seen on the Guild stage before. Hopefully, these are things that give you a wonderful experience and help you remember that "anything can happen if you let it."

Josh Woodard Director, Mary Poppins e all love Mary Poppins' friend Bert, who sings about his life as a chimney sweep. While Mary Poppins has memorable scenes of Bert and his fellow chimney sweeps dancing on the rooftops of London, as you might guess, sweeps did more than dance on roofs. In 1910, the year the show takes place, chimney sweeps' primary task was fire prevention—by cleaning the soot out of a chimney, fire was less likely to occur.

Many of you know that the Actors Guild Playhouse has been undergoing renovations, and a major portion of the project was completed earlier this year when our basement was renovated, complete with new restrooms and a new greenroom. While those changes are the most visible, the basement now also has a state-of-theart fire suppression system that includes sprinkling. We rely on this technology to keep us safe in a fire, just as over a hundred years ago the Banks family and their neighbors relied on the work of chimney sweeps.

Because of the importance of fire safety and the need to bring our theatre up to code, the next stage of our renovation project focuses on adding more fire suppression capabilities to the theatre. Instead of hiring chimney sweeps, here's what we're doing instead:

- A fire curtain will be installed to separate the stage from the auditorium seating area.
- Smoke ventilators will be installed atop the fly loft.
- Sprinklers will be added to the stage and auditorium, and preparations will be made to extend them into the lobby.

The new technology won't break out in song, but it should keep everyone safe.

Tonight, you'll hear Bert sing these lines to Jane, Michael, and Mary Poppins:

Chim Chiminey, Chim Chiminey, Chim Chim Cher-ee Now, guardian angels you don't often see. They're not high falutin', nor grand nor aloof. Nah, they're covered in soot, and they're up on your roof.

You can be a guardian angel for the Guild (and you won't end up covered in soot!) by contributing to the Capital Campaign Project.
