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### Director's Note

ou are about to see Richard Rodgers and Oscar Hammerstein's classic musical, *Cinderella*. This musical was written for television and aired March 31, 1957. It was a vehicle for Julie Andrews, who performed the title role of Cinderella.

It was the only musical Rodgers and Hammerstein wrote specifically for television. The TV version was watched by more than 100 million people. To give you an idea of how significant that number was sixty-five years ago, there were 112 million people who watched this year's Super Bowl. However, in 1957, there were only 40 million TV sets in households, which means it is estimated that it was viewed by 78 percent of America. This year's Super Bowl was viewed by 30 percent of America.

In 1957, CBS was looking for a musical for Julie Andrews, who they had just signed to a contract and who was currently starring on Broadwayin*My Fair Lady*. Rodgers recalled, in his autobiography: "What sold us immediately was the chance to work with Julie."

The musical was revived twice for TV, once in 1965 and again in 1997. The 1965 revival starred Lesley Ann Warren as Cinderella and the 1997 version starred Whitney Houston as the fairy godmother. It was later adapted for stage – the most recent and the version you are about to see – on Broadway in 2013.

This Rodgers and Hammerstein musical is based on the French version of the fairy tale by Charles Perrault, whose story concerns a young woman forced into a life of servitude by her cruel stepmother and self-centered stepsisters. Cinderella dreams of a better life. In Perrault's version, Cinderella is transformed into a princess and finds her prince. While most people know the Disney version of Cinderella, the Rodgers and Hammerstein version foregoes a stairway smeared with pitch to stop Cinderella's midnight departure. In fact, this Cinderella deliberately goes back and places her slipper on the stairs for the prince to find, knowing the prince will search the kingdom for the owner of this slipper.

Rodgers and Hammerstein's musical emphasizes that people should work for what they want instead of wishing and dreaming for it. It also tells the audience that people should look for true love rather than a set up marriage that has no such feelings. Nor does this version kill off Cinderella's real mother to set up a second marriage for her father to a woman with two children of her own. We come into this version after Cinderella's father has passed, leaving the house to his second wife in his will.

In the Disney version, Cinderella is seen as helpless and weak. Rodgers and Hammerstein's Cinderella is quite strong and not afraid to speak her mind, even to royalty.

In one of their exchanges, Cinderella tells the prince that as king he must "pay attention to things that people tell you to ignore." She tells the prince people are having their lands taken and being forced into poverty and that he must do something about it when he becomes king. Rodgers and Hammerstein's musical is all about empowerment.

Rodgers and Hammerstein make it quite clear that their version is nothing like Disney's movie.

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
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
