
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
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












SYNOPSIS

t's 1959, and Rydell High School's senior class is in rare form. The too-coolfor-school "Burger Palace Boys" are stealing hub-caps and acting tough and their gum-snapping, chain-smoking "Pink Ladies" are looking hot in bobby sox and pedal pushers. The 1950s high school dream is about to explode in this

rollicking musical that is both an homage to the idealism of the fifties and a satire of high schoolers' age-old desire to be provocative and rebellious. At the heart of the story is the romance between hot-rodding gangster Danny Zuko and the sweet new girl in town, Sandy Dumbrowski. They had a secret romance in summer, but now back in the context of school, peerpressure and cliques make their love a bit more complicated. Can Danny maintain his cool dude status and still make demure Sandy his girl?





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Who's Who in the Cast & Crew

On an unrelated note, Pepto-Bismol is the same in Tennessee and West Virginia. He also spent a week overlaying Elvis with John Denver. While the acclimation trial failed miserably, he still moved and is excited to be involved with the Actors Guild.

ALLEY GEORGE (Jan/Radio Singing Voice) is making her Actors Guild debut as an adult in *Grease*! She was last seen on our stage in *Music Man JR*. as part of the ensemble. Alley lives in Marietta with her amazingly supportive husband and daughter. She co-owns Crafting like a Mother and co-leads Girl Scout Troop 10148. You may have seen her in productions such as Shout! The Mod Musical, The Producers, and Love, Loss, and What I Wore. This is Randi's very first lead role and she is hopelessly devoted to singing her heart out for you. Maraming salamat to her massively supportive family and friends, her baby geniuses Lily and Josephine, and her one true greaser, Brian.

R.J. LOWE (Director) was last seen at the Actors Guild seducing little old ladies as Max Bialystock in The Producers and donning the candy-cane tights of Buddy the Elf in Elf the Musical*. Since 1985, he's been active onstage and off: Fiddler on the Roof (Tevye*); Big Fish (Edward Bloom*); Mamma Mia! (director*); The Story of My Life (Alvin Kelby, AACT Best Actor Award); Hairspray (Edna Turnblad); Into the Woods (Baker), and MANY more. At MOVP: Nunsense A-*Men* (director*/Reverend Mother*); ... Charlie Brown (Snoopy*) and more. A graduate of NYC's AMDA, R.J. performed/directed professionally for six years. (*=Khalil Award)

HEATHER HEPBURN (Assistant Director) has been with AGP since 2004. You may have watched her as Deloris Van-Cartier in *Sister Act* or maybe as Paulette, Berta, Motor Mouth Maybelle, Eddie/Dr. Scott, Bloody Mary, or Gary Coleman to name a few. She has several OCTA Awards including Outstanding in *Acting* in *Doubt* as Ms. Muller. AGP's *Red Velvet Cake Wars* was her directorial debut. She is blessed to be involved with several area theatres including MOVP where Ms. Hepburn was awarded the Khalil for her portrayal of Steel in *A Piece of My Heart*. Also at MOVP she directed *Odd Couple*.

BARBARA FULL (Music Director) has been active at AGP since 1975, appearing in over 40 shows, including Sound of Music (twice), Mary Poppins, Sister Act, Tom Sawyer, August: Osage County, Dixie Swim Club, Secret Garden (twice), Into the Woods (twice), Beauty and the Beast, Civil War, 1776, Damn Yankees, Barnum. Directing credits: Fiddler on the Roof, Addams Family, Shrek, Rent, Avenue Q, Doubt, Annie, Tommy; music directing: Elf, Christmas Story, Full Monty, Spamalot. She's a member of the Guild's Board of Trustees, retired music teacher (Neale School), active at the

Smoot Theatre with Camp Vaudeville, and directs The Children's Chorus.

LYNDSAY NIKOLE RICHARDS (Stage Manager) is thrilled to return for her fifth production at the Actors Guild. She has previously taken part back stage in Little Shop of Horrors and A Christmas Story, as well as taking on the role of stage manager in La Cage Aux Folles and The Producers. She is a chemical operator by trade and enjoys time at the Guild herding humans and calling cues. She practices her role by yelling PLACES to her four dogs at dinner and wrangling her four cats during chaos. She is loved and supported by her fantastic wife, Cassie Cline.

ALEXIS PARSONS (Choreographer) is thrilled to be working with the endlessly talented cast of Grease! This is Alexis' second time as a choreographer at the Actors Guild having previously worked on *The Producers*, but she has also choreographed Shrek The Musical, Beauty and the Beast, Spring Awakening, and g to 5 The Musical. Alexis also appears onstage whenever possible, and has had the immense pleasure of playing Audrey in Little Shop of Horrors, Ulla in The Producers, Elizabeth Benning in Young Frankenstein, and Janet Weiss in The Rocky Horror Show at the Actors Guild. She'd like to thank the cast.

JIM JACOBS (Book, Music and Lyrics) who created *Grease* (in 1970) with Warren Casey, was born and raised on the mean streets of Chicago's far northwest side. During the golden era of rock 'n' roll (1956-1960) he was a guitar-playing "greaser" student at Taft High School. In 1963, Jacobs met Warren Casey when they were both cast in a local theatre production of *A Shot in the Dark*. Seven years later they wrote what was to become one of the greatest musicals of all time. *Grease* opened in 1971 in a former trolley barn called the Kingston Mines

Theatre in Chicago. A year later, *Grease* made it to Broadway and "Greasemania" took off, resulting in one of the longest running shows in Broadway history. The 1978 movie became and remains the highest grossing movie musical of all time. Originally an actor, Jacobs has been seen on television, in motion pictures, regional theatre, national tours, and on Broadway. He is the co-author of several other plays and musicals including *Island* of Lost Coeds, a musical spoof of the low budget sci-fi/horror/jungle movies of the 1950s, which he wrote with Warren Casey. In May 2014, Mr. Jacobs was presented with an honorary doctorate degree from Columbia College in Chicago. He currently resides in Southern California and remains active in the theatre, especially with the American Theatre Company of Chicago.

WARREN CASEY (Author, Composer and Lyricist) was born in Yonkers, New York, and attended Syracuse University. During the late '50s, he learned all about "greasers" while working as an art teacher in upstate New York. He moved to Chicago in 1962, where he hoped to pursue an acting career. He appeared in dozens of productions, including creating the role of Bernie Litko in David Mamet's Sexual Perversity in Chicago. He supported himself with jobs in retail, including working as an assistant manager of a chain of apparel stores, and as a record salesman. In the meantime, he taught himself how to play the guitar and began writing songs. Mr. Casey acted with the Chicago Stage Guild (where he met Jim Jacobs), the Old Town Players, and the Kingston Mines Theatre. The latter company staged the original production of *Grease* which he wrote with Jim lacobs. After the incredible success of both the musical and the movie, the two collaborated on Island of Lost Coeds, a musical satire of the B-movies of the 1950s. Mr. Casey died in 1988.
