A Letter from the President

Y FIRST "BEST FRIEND" was Danny. We met at a small church in Seneca, South Carolina, and quickly became buddies. During my dad's sermons, we would sit beside each other – passing notes (and trying not to get caught) and laughing (until we did get caught and

were hushed by the mom we were sitting with that day). As soon as the church service was over, we'd rush out of the building to play tag or some game of our creation. I still remember Danny's crooked smile and blue eyes, and the way he'd laugh when I said something particularly funny.

As C.S. Lewis once noted, "Friendship is unnecessary, like philosophy, like art... It has no survival value; rather it is one of those things that give value to survival." Today's production will remind you of the friends you've had, the ones you've lost, and those you will cherish forever. I hope it will encourage you to tell your friends the value they bring to your life and, perhaps, inspire you to contact the friends who have faded into memories.




